Commissioner Brent Bailey Recognizes Energy Efficiency Day

JACKSON, MS— Mississippi Public Service Commissioner Brent Bailey of the Central District announced the recognition of Energy Efficiency Day 2021 today, October 6, in the state of Mississippi.

At a special meeting on September 29, upon a motion put forth by Commissioner Bailey, the Commission adopted a [Proclamation](#) recognizing October 6, 2021, as Energy Efficiency Day in Mississippi.

“Energy Efficiency Day is a daylong national campaign to increase the public awareness and education on energy efficiency by highlighting the urgency of energy-saving efforts to lower bills, reduce emissions and create jobs,” Commissioner Bailey said. “We urge the residents of Mississippi to learn more about energy efficiency and to apply smart energy practices in their daily lives.”

The national 2021 Energy Efficiency Day message is: “Save Money. Cut Carbon.
