## Highlights from the Central District:

**Building for Mississippi's Future** 

As we close out the year, I want to take a moment to reflect on the progress we've made together across the Central District and throughout Mississippi. From strengthening our energy infrastructure to investing in economic growth and supporting families during the holiday season, this year has been defined by forward momentum and service.

A Major Step Forward for Mississippi's Energy Future

This month in Vicksburg, we marked a historic milestone with the demolition of the former Baxter Wilson Steam Electric Station, clearing the way for the Vicksburg Advanced Power Station, scheduled to come online in 2028. This transition reflects Mississippi's growing energy needs and the importance of **modern, reliable** infrastructure to support economic development, grid resilience, and long-term growth. Building for the future means making thoughtful decisions today—and this project represents exactly that kind of progress.

Investing in the Delta & Rural Communities

The Delta Regional Authority (DRA) recently announced nearly \$37 million in investments through the States' Economic Development Assistance Program supporting critical infrastructure, transportation, workforce development, and business growth across the Delta and Black Belt regions. Mississippi alone received \$5.7 million, funding projects in communities large and small-from water systems and workforce training to municipal and economic development initiatives. This represents a 94.7% increase in DRA SEDAP funding from last year, demonstrating a renewed commitment to ensuring our rural communities thrive.

Workforce & Economic Opportunity Economic growth is strongest when people can see themselves in it. This year, we highlighted career opportunities across Mississippi-from economic development and disaster recovery to marketing, communications, and digital strategy—helping connect Mississippians with meaningful pathways into public

service and community development.

**Showing Up for Our Communities** Public service is about more than policy—it's about presence.

- I had the honor of serving as keynote speaker at the NAACP Vicksburg Branch Freedom Fund Banquet, sharing a message rooted in hope, urgency,
- In Holmes County, we recognized Mr. James Anderson, age 102, a military veteran honored for a life of service and strength.
- Our Central District team spent time volunteering with Stewpot Community Services, ensuring families had access to quality food and support during difficult times.




